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Inflation in December 2012 fell to 8.8%

The Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures changes over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2002, the base year, which has an index of 100.

December 2012 rate of inflation

The year-on-year inflation as measured by the CPI stood at 8.8 per cent in December 2012, down from the 9.3 per cent recorded in November 2012 (Table 1). This rate of inflation for December 2012 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelvemonth period from December 2011 (371.2) to December 2012 (404.0).

The monthly change rate for December 2012 was 0.7 per cent. As indicated in Table 1, the monthly rate recorded in November 2012 was 0.5 percent.


Food and non-food inflation

The **Food and non-alcoholic beverages** group recorded an average year-on-year inflation rate of 3.9 per cent, the same as recorded in November 2012. Eight subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages

group recorded inflation rates above the group's average inflation rate of 3.9 per cent (Figure 1).

The non-food group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 11.6 per cent. Six subgroups recorded year-on-year inflation rates above the group's average rate (Figure 2). **Transport** recorded the highest rate of 20.6 per cent followed by **Education** with16.5 per cent, and **Alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics** (16.5 %). Inflation was lowest in the **Communications** subgroup (0.4%).

Regional differentials

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 6.2 per cent in the Upper East/Upper West Regions to 11.2 per cent in the Greater Accra Region.




Figure 3: Year –on-year Inflation by region, December 2012

Three regions (Greater Accra, Central and Northern) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 8.8 per cent (Figure 3).

Dissemination

A bulletin on the December 2012 CPI and more detailed data in time series format have been posted on the GSS website *www.statsghana.gov.gh*. The target publication date of the monthly CPI newsletter is the 15th of each month. It is released on the second Wednesday of each month, and on the third, when the 15th of the month falls on Wednesday. The next release date is 13th February 2012.

Figure 2: Non Food Inflation, December 2012







Regional inflation rates (Year-on-year) - December 2012


