

PREFACE

The need for improving statistics and indicators specifically concerned with the situation of women was first recognized internationally by the World Conference of the International Women's Year in 1975. The third and the fourth World Conferences on Women that took place in Nairobi, 1985, and in Beijing, 1995, also recognized that different policies, programmes and actions had not had much impact in bringing about gender equality and stressed the need for gender-specific data as a necessary starting point for any programme aimed at advancing the situation of women.

Statistical publications and survey reports abound in Ghana, but none of these is devoted solely to gender issues. This maiden publication addresses the issue of gender and statistics, a critical consideration for policies and programmes for the promotion of equal opportunities for women and men, girls and boys. These statistics are also indispensable for evidence-based decisionmaking for optimal productivity and socio-economic security of all members of the society. The production of gender statistics is also an important requirement for tracking progress in the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals, one of which, Goal 3, emphasizes the need to eliminate gender disparities in educational levels, literacy rates, wage employment and political participation as a means to sustainable development.

This compendium responds to the First National Gender Statistics Workshop¹ call for, more integrated presentation of statistics in a popular format, and presents the key gender concerns on which statistics are currently available: i.e., the structure of Ghana's population, its distribution across region and districts, as well as

selected localities; and presents statistics on health, economics, education, industrial distribution, work and employment, crime and power and influence. Data for this publication are derived from censuses and surveys conducted by the Statistical Service, as well as administrative records of Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs).

The Statistical Service is grateful to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) for supporting this effort. The Service would also like to express its profound appreciation to the Women and Children Ministry, Domestic Violence and Victim Support Unit, the Prisons Service and other MDAs who contributed to this publication in diverse ways. Several other experts have supported this endeavour with their comments and substantive advice, which are also much appreciated.

We hope that this publication will serve to bring statistics closer to our stakeholders and users and will result in enhanced statistical literacy to bring statistics to the fore in our routine decisionmaking.








Fig.5.1: Persons Admitted in Prison Centres, 2000-2004




Fig. 1.2: Population by Age 1970 ('000)

Fig. 4.5: Age Profile of Pensioners, 1998-2001






Fig. 1.3: Population by Age 1984 ('000)




Fig. 1.4: Population by Age 2000 ('000)







Fig. 1.8: Population by Age and Locality of Residence, 2000







Fig. 1.10: Household Composition by Status (1970-2000)





Fig. 4.2: Unemployment Rate by Education






Fig. 3.6: Life Expectancy Rate by Region





Fig. 4: Percentage of Women and Men Exposed to Family Planning messages in the Media





Fig. 3.2: Total Fertility Rate by Level of Education (1988-2000)


