Inflation Rate for November 2018 fell to 9.3%

The Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2012, the base year, which has an index of 100.

November 2018 rate of inflation

The year-on-year inflation rate as measured by the CPI was 9.3 percent in November 2018, down by 0.2 percentage point from the 9.5 percent recorded in October 2018 (Table 1). This rate of inflation for November 2018 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelve-month period, from November 2017 to November 2018.

The monthly change rate for November 2018 was 0.7 percent same as the rate recorded for October 2018.


Food and non-food inflation

The **Food and non-alcoholic beverages** group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 8.6 percent. This is 0.3 percentage point lower than the rate recorded in October 2018. Six subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded inflation rates higher than the group's average rate of 8.6 percent (Figure 1).

The Non-food group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 9.7 percent in November 2018, compared to the 9.8 percent recorded for October 2018. Five subgroups recorded year-on-year inflation rates higher than the group's average rate of 9.7 percent (Figure 2). Transport recorded the highest inflation rate of 13.7 percent, followed by Recreation and culture with 13.3 percent, Clothing and footwear with 12.6 percent, Furnishings, household equipment and routine maintenance with 11.4 percent and Miscellaneous goods and services with 10.3 percent. Inflation was lowest in the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Others Fuels subgroup (3.1%).


Regional differentials




Figure 3: Year-on-year Inflation rate (%) by region, November 2018

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 7.6 percent in Upper East region to 11.5 percent in Upper West region. Five regions (Upper West, Brong Ahafo, Western, Ashanti and Northern) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 9.3 percent (Figure 3)

Dissemination

A bulletin on the November 2018 CPI and more detailed data in time series format have been posted on the GSS website *www.statsghana.gov.gh*. The target publication date of the monthly CPI newsletter is the 15th of each month. It is released on the second Wednesday of every month, or on the third, when the 15th of the month falls on Wednesday. The next release date is 9th January, 2019.

Figure 2: Year-on-year Non-Food Inflation (%) by major subgroups, November 2018
